


Alumni Webpage

Update on building project in Rectory Road

We are delighted to share with you the news that, at the request of the Hanholoh, work has started on the development of a new build multi-purpose study and dormitory block. It will be on the Rectory Road site that currently houses the Yeshiva administration facilities and temporary sleeping accommodation. The necessary preparatory surveys have been commissioned whilst proposed scheme options are being drawn.

The provisional plan is to accommodate over 100 beds along with shiur / vaad rooms and administration offices over 4 floors – all aesthetically done with full landscaping.

MHW Architects and Fairhurst Planning Consultants have been appointed to lead this exciting project. We are likewise fortunate to have the services of a team of skilled consultants to manage the project – all are grateful alumni with experience in the construction industry.

We are confident that together we will make this a serious contribution to benefit the Yeshiva we hold so dear. This project is named LDovid Mizmor in tribute to the lifelong dedication and askonus of R' Dovid Chontow z'l on behalf of the Yeshiva.

Elul Zman 5781 Report

The Elul Zman commenced with over 420 Bochurim learning שייעורים. לא יחפר- פרק ב' בבא בתרא. The daily שייעורים have all swung into action, and likewise the הלכה של ישיבה; of which the younger Shiurim are delivered by Rabbi E Lieberman שליט"א and the older shiurim delivered by Rabbi A Arran שליט"א.

As in previous years, the Yeshiva accommodated the "Chodosh" programme for all school leavers who planned and had been accepted to join the Yeshiva. The morning shiur was given by Horav Shimon Grun שליט"א and the afternoon shiur was given by Horav Refoel Lieberman שליט"א. Their שייעור הלכה was given by Horav Avrohom Arran שליט"א. They enjoyed a weekly shiur from Reb Ezriel Rosenbaum שליט"א שבת.

The Yeshiva Beis Hamidrash is full to capacity. At all times there are משיבים in attendance assisting the בני הישיבה. Shmuesen and Vaadim for the older Shiurim are given by the Mashgiach, Horav Karnowsky שליט"א, and for the younger Shiurim, the shmussen alternate between Rabbi Grun שליט"א and Rabbi Feld שליט"א. Rabbi Feld שליט"א's afternoon shiur for the 3rd shiur has continued for a second year, and is being gratefully received.

Furthermore, now for a second year, there is a weekly written חומש רש"י verher. All the talmidim who achieve the grade after each sefer receive a generous prize.

This has encouraged many to learn חומש רש"י more diligently.

The Yeshiva has now begun to make full use of all recent dormitory refurbishments, including 56 Rectory Road (27 beds) and upstairs 60 Rectory Road (15 beds).

We are also pleased to report that the Yeshiva over the past year, enjoyed major "Siyato Dismayo" with all the arrangements employed to help protect the Hanholo and the Talmidim from the risk of Covid-19. This included many portable screens in the Beis Hamedrash & shiur rooms. All risk assessments were updated on a regular basis. Signage on the walls, stairs and corridor floors were all approved by the Gateshead Council Environmental Health Dept. The Yeshiva had in place provisions for a quarantine area in case of need. Mr Guttentag kept a close watch on the travel documentation that was required by all the foreign Talmidim. The Yeshiva is still receiving most regular visits from the "Test & Trace" division of the NHS.

בעזרה שיי"ת, it is foreseen that for the forthcoming Winter Zman 5782 ט"ו הבעל"ט, the Yeshiva will also be full to capacity, and this is after the Hanhla Hayeshiva שליט"א have had to make many difficult decisions vis-a-vis applications for entry to the Yeshiva, as they were unable to accommodate approximately 160 applicants for this year.

Changes & Improvements

Improvements in Beis Hamedrash

Over the recent Pesach break, an improved Public Address system (with 14 extra speakers) was installed in the Beis Hamedrash. During the Summer break a new feature was added i.e. a special unit with 12 multiple ports that allows the Talmidim to connect their devices directly to the PA system. Additionally there has been a further upgrade to the lighting.

56 & 60 Rectory Road refurbishment

As mentioned in last year's Elul newsletter, the Yeshiva needed extra accommodation due to the expansion of the Yeshiva, and also for general compliance as well as Covid management. During the Succos Bein Hazmanim, conversion and building work was commenced and carried out at the first floor at 60 Rectory Road (above bakery) and at 56 Rectory Road to create additional dormitory facilities. Both areas were ready shortly after Chanukah, providing the Yeshiva with an additional 14 rooms holding 42 beds. Both these areas are fully equipped

with all the essential facilities and additional features as is now standard at the Yeshiva.

Hot Water Urn

Family Horav Doniel Levy of Leeds recently sponsored the purchase and installation of a new five hundred litre kettle in the Dining Room. This sponsorship initiated by Horav Levy was a token of the *hachnasas* for the many years that he spent in the Yeshiva. The kettle, fully automated to meet all the Halachic criteria of *shabbat* was installed towards the end of the summer zman.

First Y'mei Limud in Gateshead Yeshiva

The two-day Y'mei Limud event held in Gateshead Yeshiva was a resounding success. Since its inception over 90 years ago, many thousands of talmidim have passed through the halls of our Yeshiva, emerging transformed, to create their own families, steeped in the tradition of their fathers. In many instances, the yeshivah has seen three or four generations coming to learn Torah at the feet of the Gedolim who lead it.

The latest project of the Alumni Association was the Y'mei Limud, when the Hanholo extended a warm invitation to former talmidim to come back to the Yeshivah, for two exciting days, sitting side-by-side with the bachurim, and participating in the same shiurim.

Back to Gateshead

The event began on Sunday July 4th at midday, with the arrival of guests from London, Manchester and Antwerp along with special COVID-compliant group travel arrangements.

After the reception prepared in the Bewick Centre, our one hundred and more guests gravitated down Windermere Street and slipped seamlessly back to where it all began.

The objective of the Y'mei Limud was to reconnect, refresh and rejuvenate. The current sugya chosen in the second perek of Maseches Bava Basra. Introductory shiurim were given by Harav Yosef Aharon Oppenheimer and Harav Eliyohu Gurwicz, both gave their own individual insights into the sugya.

Two Days of Learning

Divrei pesichah were delivered by Harav Chaim Ozer Gurwicz in the main beis medrash in front of the whole Yeshivah, thanking Hashem that learning has BH returned to normal after the pandemic. His inspiring droshoh focused on the contrast between the bitachon nisyonos of a man dedicated to learning Torah the whole day, and the emunah nisyonos of a businessman.

As the Y'mei Limud participants joined the beis medrash, they were met with the incomparable roar of the voices of hundreds of bachurim all learning and delving into the depths of the gemoro. Memories of old, as they sat down to learn with their chavrusos. They too, added their voices to the milchamta shel Torah that was taking place around them.

The beis medrash fell silent at 6pm as our revered Rosh Hayeshivah Harav Avrohom shlit'a mounted the steps to stand in front of the golden Aron Kodesh and expound his Shiur Kloli on the yesodos of some of the obligations relevant to repaying a debt.

At the conclusion, a large crowd of bachurim gathered around the Rosh Hayeshivah to eagerly discuss the words of Torah. Once again, the guests were reminded of their own yeshivah years and the impact those

Later that evening, the Y'mei Limud guests, together with the Rosh HaYeshivah and all our Rabbonim gathered together in the Bewick Centre for an evening dinner. He thanked Mr. Shimon Guttentag, Mr. Naftoli (Totty) Lebrecht and their entire team of helpers along with the London team led by Yossi Binstock .
